



Dear family and friends,

I am pleased to report that earlier today the Maine CDC officially classified the Cape Memory Care COVID-19 case as closed.

In order for a senior living community's outbreak to be considered as "closed" by the CDC, 28 days must pass with no additional cases reported following the last positive COVID-19 individual case being closed. According to the CDC, a person is no longer considered active once they have passed 10 days from the initial positive test date and are no longer exhibiting any symptoms associated with COVID-19.

Cape Memory Care was able to close the last individual COVID-19 case on June 8<sup>th</sup>.

Over the past 48 days we have worked closely with the Maine CDC and have completed 4 separate rounds of testing. We are thankful to have a wonderful community of residents and staff who were extremely cooperative and helpful throughout the process.
