Dear Families and Friends,

We are writing to update you on the COVID-19 occurrence at Woodlands Memory Care of Farmington.

On Sunday, January 10th, we conducted the 6th round of universal COVID-19 testing of all residents and all staff. The results of the 112 samples arrived today and we learned that two residents in Memory Care, one resident in Assisted Living and one staff member in Memory Care have tested positive for COVID-19.

All samples taken from Park Residences residents and all staff members working in Assisted Living and Park Residences once again came back negative.

We will continue to conduct testing for all staff and all residents on the Farmington campus every four days until there are two consecutive test dates with no positive results. At that point the outbreak will be considered resolved by the CDC.

The next round of universal testing of all residents and all staff will occur Thursday, January 14th.

While many of the Memory Care residents who tested positive early on in this occurrence have fully recovered, all residents in Memory Care – positive and negative alike - continue to receive daily personalized health monitoring and support from not only our dedicated Woodlands Senior Living staff but also professionals from Androscoggin Home Health and a Nurse Practitioner from Franklin Memorial Health.

We are sensitive to the heightened concern shared by all those associated with Woodlands Senior Living of Farmington during this outbreak, so we will continue to provide you with open and timely updates as they become available.
